## A New Law Could Make it Easier for Companies to Avoid Paying Injury Victims



When a product on the market has injured multiple people, the victims can band together to file a single lawsuit, called a class action, to get the benefits they deserve. However, new legislation under consideration in the U.S. House of Representatives could make it much harder for victims in class action suits to win compensation for their injuries. Under the “Fairness in Class Action Litigation Act of 2015” (H.R. 1927), federal courts can reject class action suits if each party in the lawsuit suffered a wide range of injuries (rather than a single common type of harm) caused by a defective

product. The legislation also requires victims to produce a significant amount of evidence of injury in order to be included in a suit. Read more about the [potential damage this measure could do if it becomes federal law](#).
